<b>2008</b>	<b>Annual Conference-Washington DC:</b> The 2008 program consisted of 31 universities, which represents 83 students and eleven corporations. The winning teams are: <b>1st Place: Florida A &amp; M University - \$15,000, 2nd Place: University of Tennessee - \$12,000 and 3rd Place: University of Texas at Austin - \$8,000</b>
<b>2007</b>	<b>Annual Conference-Orlando, FL:</b> The 2007 program consisted of <b>30</b> universities, winning teams were: 1st place: Florida A & M University - \$15,000, 2nd place: New York University - \$12,000 and 3rd place: University of Chicago - \$8,000
<b>2006</b>	<b>Annual Conference-Atlanta, GA:</b> The 2006 program consisted of <b>29</b> universities, winning teams were: 1st place: University of Stellenbosch, <i>South Africa</i> - \$15,000, 2nd place: Hampton University - \$12,000, and 3rd place: University of Georgia - \$8,000
<b>2005</b>	<b>Annual Conference-San Diego, CA:</b> The 2005 program consisted of <b>28</b> universities, winning teams were University of Georgia, first place (\$15,000), Michigan State University, second place (\$12,000), Pennsylvania State, and third place (\$8,000).
<b>2004</b>	<b>Annual Conference-Houston, TX:</b> The 2004 program consisted of <b>30</b> universities, winning teams were: 1 <sup>st</sup> Place Michigan State University (\$12,000), 2 <sup>nd</sup> Place Georgia State University (\$9,000), and 3 <sup>rd</sup> Place Baylor University (\$6,000).
<b>2003</b>	<b>Annual Conference-Philadelphia, PA:</b> The 2003 program consisted of <b>34</b> universities, the winning teams were: Vanderbilt University (\$12,000), Emory University (\$9,000), and Bentley College (\$6,000).
<b>2002</b>	<b>Annual Conference-Nashville, TN:</b> The 2002 program consisted of <b>32</b> universities. The winning teams were Michigan State University (\$12,000), University of California-Los Angeles (\$9,000), and University of Michigan (\$6,000).

<p><b>2001</b></p>	<p><b>Washington DC-Independent:</b> This competition included <b>11</b> universities competing for three winning slots. The winning teams were, <b>University of North Carolina – Chapel Hill, New York University</b> and <b>Rutgers University</b>. Each winning team received a <b>\$9,000</b> scholarship award.</p>	<p><b>Nashville, TN Independent:</b> The Nashville competition included <b>6</b> universities. The winning teams were, <b>The Ohio State University, Belmont University,</b> and <b>Vanderbilt University</b>. Each winning team received a <b>\$9,000</b> scholarship award.</p>	<p><b>Annual Conference-Buena Vista, FL:</b> The 2001 program team participation included <b>32</b> universities competing for three winning slots. The winning teams were <b>University of California-Los Angeles</b> (\$12,000); <b>Michigan State University</b> (\$9,000); and <b>Thunderbird</b> (\$6,000).</p>
<p><b>2000</b></p>	<p><b>Atlanta, GA-Independent:</b> This competition included <b>10</b> universities competing for three winning slots. The winning teams were, <b>Howard University, The Ohio State University,</b> and <b>University of Virginia</b>. Each winning team received a <b>\$9,000</b> scholarship award.</p>	<p><b>New York, NY-Independent:</b> This competition included <b>8</b> universities competing for three winning slots. The winning teams were <b>Columbia Business School, New York State University</b> and <b>The Wharton School</b>. Each winning team received a <b>\$9,000</b> scholarship award.</p>	<p><b>Annual Conference-Chicago, IL:</b> The 2000 program team participation included <b>30</b> universities competing for three winning slots. The winning teams were 1st place, <b>Purdue University</b> (\$12,000), 2nd place, <b>Pennsylvania State University</b> (\$9,000), 3rd place <b>Duke University</b> (\$6,000).</p>
<p><b>1999</b></p>	<p><b>Boston, MA-Independent:</b> This competition included <b>5</b> universities competing for three winning slots. The winning teams were <b>Boston College, Pennsylvania State University,</b> and <b>Simmons College</b>. Each winning team received a <b>\$9,000</b> scholarship award.</p>	<p><b>Columbus, OH-Independent:</b> This competition included <b>8</b> universities competing for three winning slots. The winning teams were, <b>Case Western Reserve, Ohio State University,</b> and <b>Xavier University</b>. Each winning team received a <b>\$9,000</b> scholarship award.</p>	<p><b>Annual Conference-Anaheim, CA:</b> The 1999 program team participation included <b>29</b> universities competing for three winning slots. The winning teams were <b>1st place, University of Michigan</b> (\$12,000), <b>2nd place, University of Virginia</b> (\$9,000), <b>3rd place Georgetown University</b> (\$6,000.)</p>
<p><b>1998</b></p>	<p><b>Annual Conference-Detroit, MI:</b> The 1998 program included <b>29</b> universities competing for three winning slots. The winning teams were: <b>1<sup>st</sup> place,</b></p>	<p><b>Winston-Salem, NC-Independent:</b> This first competition held outside of the Annual Conference included <b>7</b> universities competing for the three winning slots. The winning teams</p>	

	<b>UCLA (\$7,500); 2<sup>nd</sup> place, Johns Hopkins University (\$6,000); 3<sup>rd</sup> place, University of Tennessee (\$4,500).</b>	were <b>Duke University, Fayetteville State University, and University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill</b> . Each winning team received a <b>\$9,000</b> scholarship award.
<b>1997</b>	<b>Annual Conference-Dallas, TX:</b> The 1997 program team participation again increased to a record <b>30</b> universities competing for scholarship honors. The winning teams were: <b>1<sup>st</sup> place, Duke University (\$7,500); 2<sup>nd</sup> place, Stanford University (\$6,000); 3<sup>rd</sup> place, University of North Carolina (\$4,500).</b>	
<b>1996</b>	<b>Annual Conference-New Orleans, LA:</b> The 1996 program team participation increased to <b>29</b> universities competing for the top rankings. The winning teams were: <b>1<sup>st</sup> place, Emory University (\$7,500); 2<sup>nd</sup> place, Johns Hopkins University (\$6,000); 3<sup>rd</sup> place, University of Tennessee (\$4,500).</b>	
<b>1995</b>	<b>Annual Conference-Boston, MA:</b> The 1995 program team participation included <b>27</b> universities competing for three winning slots. Judges were solicited through our corporate partners and NBMBA board members. The winning teams were: <b>1<sup>st</sup> place, University of Tennessee (\$7,500); 2<sup>nd</sup> place, Johns Hopkins University (\$6,000); 3<sup>rd</sup> place, Stanford University (\$4,500).</b>	
<b>1994</b>	<b>Annual Conference-San Francisco, CA:</b> The 1994 program included the participation of <b>24</b> universities competing for three winning slots. Judges were solicited through our corporate partners and NBMBA board members. The winning teams were: <b>1<sup>st</sup> place, Johns Hopkins University (\$7,500); 2<sup>nd</sup> place, University of California - Berkeley (\$6,000); 3<sup>rd</sup> place University of Tennessee (\$4,500).</b>	
<b>1993</b>	<b>Annual Conference-Atlanta, GA:</b> In 1993 there were <b>22</b> universities that competed for the top three winning slots. The program was expanded into two half days of competitions with our corporate partners, NBMBA board members and academic advisors participating as judges. The winning teams were: <b>1<sup>st</sup> place, University of Michigan (\$7,500); 2<sup>nd</sup> place, University of Southern California (\$6000); 3<sup>rd</sup> place, University of Alabama-Birmingham (\$4,500).</b>	
<b>1992</b>	<b>Annual Conference-St. Louis:</b> The 1992 competition included a total of <b>21</b> participating universities. Winning teams were: <b>1<sup>st</sup> place, Purdue University, and 2<sup>nd</sup> place, American University</b> (the teams received \$3000 for first place and \$1500 for second plus gifts from Amoco, for a total of \$5,740).
